DUMP HOURS – The dump will be open on Saturdays 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, or upon request from Village Resident. To open dump outside of Saturdays, contact Jim Steeb, Kyle Resch, Robert Bernitt, Mountain Bay Bar. Why is the dump gate being locked? Persons from outside the Village have been bringing items and leaving them in the dump area. This has resulted in costs to the Village to dispose of those items.

The Village of Eland does not require Burning Permits. However, Village records do state that if a property owner does burn, they are solely responsible for paying any claims, bills, or damages that result from the burning. The Village Board encourages you to find other alternatives than burning. The former Village Dump site is open to residents for disposing of their brush and yard waste. Please make sure that no plastic bags or anything non-biodegradable is left behind. We encourage residents to utilize this in lieu of burning.

FALL CLEAN UP

Large item pick-up for Eland is scheduled for **Friday, October 18, 2024**. Have your large items at your regular curbside collection site to be picked up. There are a few things that Harter's will not pick up, including:
